Course Description: Matrices, determinants, systems of linear equations, vector spaces, linear transformations, and characteristic value problems.

Prerequisite: Math 122.
Textbook: Linear Algebra with Applications, Fifth Edition by Gareth Williams, 2005, Jones and Bartlett Publishers.

Course Format: Lectures, homework, weekly quizzes, four regular exams and a final exam. See the schedule below for reading assignments and exam dates.

Grades: Each assignment is awarded between 0 and 100 points. Your exam scores are averaged and are worth $45 \%$ of your grade. Quiz scores are averaged and are worth $20 \%$ of your grade. Homework scores are averaged and are worth $15 \%$ of your grade. The final exam score is worth $20 \%$ of your grade. I will use the following grade scale:

How to Study for this Class: Take notes during the lecture as needed. Read the textbook and my handouts carefully and make a note of questions to ask in class. Do the homework carefully and make a note of questions to ask in class.

Do not rip the pages out of a spiral notebook. Do not submit class notes as your own work. I will look over your homework and make comments as necessary.
